Why school librarian leadership?
Important from an advocacy perspective
Principal needs to see teacher librarian as leader
Gain support of state department of education
Developing collaboration with teachers – establishing trust
**important to teach because our students don't see themselves as leaders
Leadership takes many forms
Give our students confidence
Confidence leaders to effective programs
Elevates teacher librarian with in educational community
Developing leadership for student achievement
Model leadership for students

Why doesn't our research focus on student achievement?

Challenging research

School/student access

Working with teacher librarians and teachers

We see the same thing with principals – very little research about the impact of the principal role.

Direct impact is difficult to isolate Isolating certain factors is impossible Assessments don't follow Achievement is difficult to define Test scores?

Why fewer research proposal in digital technologies? Widespread inequity about tech access Defining parameters of the research Embedded in other practice

How do we teach collaboration?

Requirement of CAEP accreditation Will it continue to be an assessment with new standards?

Advocacy outside of our programs? Other education programs?

Guest lecture with preservice teachers Classroom teachers should also be developing collaborative lesson plans Preservice teachers and teacher librarians

Why school librarian leadership?

People don't know what SLs do – need visibility for advocacy. Important to be a leader at the building level Stand up for intellectual freedom, privacy, literacy in face of resistance Librarian as "second" dancer (See First Follower video with "commentary" on TED: <u>https://youtu.be/V74AxCqOTvg</u>)

Fewer proposals focus on student achievement Hard to measure or define High-stakes testing or other sorts of achievement Where can do- correlation rather than causation Why fewer digital technologies proposals? Don't feel confident in that area Digital competence in faculty

Put yourself out there to show what you know Prepare for what is going to happen Influencers Know the expectations – leaders and influencers

Why not student achievement?

Time in the curriculum Not having data – to put it into a curriculum Hard to pinpoint

School librarian leadership? Don't create change unless you step out there Make a difference for kids Build partnerships You work with everybody Connect from partnership Position in school is between administration and instruction/classroom Principals are in that position – SLs are not Have the opportunity on student to student instruction Understanding of what's taught across the curriculum Challenge for education SLMS in helping them get their visions Students scared to step up (first teachers before SLMS) Have to have that (leadership) vision because it is a unique role Role of influencer

Why fewer study proposals focused on student achievement? Hard to define "student achievement" Hard to pull out/make this area discrete from other areas of measurement Difference between correlation and causality

Why fewer tech study proposals?

Moving target

Focus on the tech/not on the kids/their skills/their learning Digital literacy is not digital technology

Collaborative lesson plan?

Students are various levels All plans/assignments have to be collaborative Clinical – have to get feedback Trying to work with education folds to get them to embed collaboration
